We want you to be safe so please use the aids we have available and report any concerns. If you are mapping in State Forests or National Parks you must wear hi-viz gear. Let the rangers know that you will be in the area and ask if there are other users in the forest. Preferably go out in pairs rather than on your own. WHO has orange vests available and owns a personal locator beacon. There has been a recent incident on a WHO map in mid-west NSW where safety was a concern. No WHO members were involved.

We will be asking members what first aid skills they have. At bush and major events St John's Ambulance attend but at urban and minor events we rely on local medical and hospital services. Having a list of members with first aid skills will allow faster response. The club is also interested in assisting members to gain first aid qualifications. If you are interested please let Ian Miller or Steve Holloway know.

WHO Metro Report – James McQuillan

Metro 1 WSU Penrith 2 April 2017



The first Metroleague event for 2017 was at WSU Penrith and hosted by Garingal. Grey skies and the threat of rain was upon us but luckily held off, providing perfect running conditions. This map suits the speedsters and doesn't hold much in navigational difficulty. We expected some intricate building/sprint work but at 1:7,500 it couldn't be that difficult and that's the way it turned out. Most courses started in the tightly knitted Kingswood campus buildings before stretching runners across the open fields to the sparse buildings on the Werrington campus. The uncrossable fence bordering the campus caught out a number of runners as the courses jumped to the adjacent campus.

For the first time WHO were represented in all 5 divisions. The Division 1 team will be supplemented by runners from Bennelong and Uringa (neither of which have a Division 1 team) and will be known as the WHO Evers. They started with a first up win against the two time defending champions, Garingal Goannas. The WHO Rays in Div 2 led by one of our newest members, Viven, lost to BF by the narrowest of margins - 1 point. GO Legless were no match for the WHO Doos in Div 3. Likewise, WHO RaHS and WHO HaHS in Div 4 and 5 comfortably dispatched BF and GO Geckos respectively. All bodes well for a successful 2017.

WHO Team's results for SL1 & 2 (March 25/26)

State League 1 arena was the Canberra Girls Grammar School Campus. A very cloudy and cool day with occasional drizzle, but good conditions for runners. Best team result was **Yekaterina Stukova** running W12A in 13:22 and breaking the finish tape at 2nd place only 59 seconds behind Ingrid Agar. **Janet Morris** (W75A) and **Barry Hanlon** (M80A) clocked into second places in their veterans classes.

The weather improved for the second day with the clouds clearing and presenting an almost clear blue sky. SL2 was held at Isaacs Ridge in a very steep pine plantation. The event could be renamed "the ACT Downhill Classic". Our team's only 1st place was **Yekaterina Stukova** who led the field in W12A with a time of only 33:25. Our club's veteran bush orienteers **Lynn Dabbs** (W65A) and **Kevin Williams** (M70A) handled the tough terrain expertly to place 2nd in their classes. Lynn was only 41 seconds behind Jenny Hawkins. **Janet Morris** maintained her 2nd position but **Barry Hanlon** dropped back to 3rd.

WHO Club Meeting discussions and decisions

We are going to run at a loss for 2017. We do have a budget and the loss is anticipated. One of our stated aims for 2017 was to do more more for our members who contribute so much to our successes. An example is the new WHO O'Suits available soon at a cost of \$40. This amount is subsidized by WHO. We also decided to pay the SL event entry fees at WHO SL for WHO members and we are also not running our usually profitable State League event in 2017.

For our May 21 Metro, we decided to stay with the usual fee structure of \$12 per entry. We have some extra fees to pay to national parks for use of the Wianamatta Park which will result in a very small surplus or a small loss. We will review the financial arrangements for Metro League events with ONSW after the May 21 event.

For future WHO events our entry fees will be \$5 for junior ONSW members, \$10 for junior non-ONSW members and senior ONSW members, \$15 for senior non-ONSW members with the family fees being 200% of the senior fee (\$20 for ONSW member families and \$30 for non-ONSW member families)".

Later this year we need to update the Club constitution as Office of Fair Trading has introduced new mandatory requirements.

ONSW Board Meetings and Executive News

There have been two recent ONSW Board Meetings. We are yet to receive the minutes for the 29 March Meeting. The previous meeting was held on February 17th and the minutes were received 16th March. The main details included - NTOC have asked for 2018 Middle and Long Championships May 21-22, Rob Vincent appointed event controller. The Board had a discussion on future national events in NSW. December 31 cash balance was \$222,045, down \$8,546 from end of 2015. NSW elite performance "well below expected standards". Target is to improve "the next generation of juniors". Goldseekers wrote expressing "concern at the levy and the value country members receive". Reply to be sent once full 2016 numbers are available. Board agreed to Ian Jessup's Metro League proposal to allow runners who are members of clubs not in Division 1 to compete for another Division 1 club as long as it is nominated at the beginning of the season and lasts for the whole season. NSW Sprint Championships to be organised by Bold Horizons at PLC. The Board will donate the levies to charity.

Orienteering Australia (OA) Meetings

OA recently held its AGM in Canberra. The main topic is concern about the financials as OA lost its high performance grant in 2016. It is possible we may see an impact as OA re-assess's their income and expenditure.

Australian Orienteering Carnival Update

(or What will you be doing in September ?) From 23rd September until the 1st October, NSW is hosting the Australian Orienteering Carnival. The event centre is at Bathurst. Bathurst hosts two events, with others are at Hill End north of Bathurst, Macquarie Woods west of Bathurst and the Australian Schools Championships on WHO's Roseberg State Forest map south of Bathurst. The Carnival will be run by teams of officials moving from location to location for each event. WHO has provided the Roseberg map. The courses at Roseberg will be set by Marina Iskhakova. The organiser for the Roseberg event is Steve Dunlop and the Controller is James McQuillan. We will need WHO members to help on the day. Four members of WHO have taken on key roles. Graeme Hill is working on the finances. Ted Mulherin is in charge of map printing. Steve Dunlop is the organiser and James McQuillan the controller for the Australian Schools Championships and the associated Public Race. WHO as a club is not running an event so please volunteer as individuals.

Entries are now open. Please enter early.

Steve Dunlop has booked 4 rooms at Hallows, Bathurst for the first weekend and up to the Tuesday of the Roseberg event. The rooms have kitchenettes. There is room for one more person and at last check there were additional rooms available. Please contact Steve Dunlop.

In the Veteran Women class, **Jan Seeho** was 19th, **Linda Chan** 21st and **Maria Stankova** 24th. In Super Veteran Men, **Martin Mansfield** was 21st and **Steve Holloway** 23rd. **Marion Gledhill** was 9th in the Legends Women class. **Graeme Hill** was 2nd (with 1200 points) in Legends Men class with **Ian Miller** 11th and **Steve Dunlop** 13th. **Ted Mulherin** was 1st and **Malcolm Gledhill** 2nd **Andy Vesey-Wells** 9th and **Barry Pearce** 10th in Immortals Men and **Janet Morris** 1st in Immortals Women (with 19 wins in 19 events). Janet was also the winner of the SSS Special Award for her contribution to SSS through participation and mapping.

Sydney Sprint Series The Sydney Sprint season is over for another year and once again WHO members did very well. Top placings were achieved by: **Andy Hill** 2nd in open men with **Amy Harmer** 4th and **Helen Parker** 13th in the Open Women class. In the Masters Men class, **James McQuillan** was 2nd **Vivien de Remy de Courcelles** 4th **Lee Coady** 9th, **Dan Smith** 11th and **Matt Hackett** 13th. **Emmanuelle Convert** was 3rd and **Belinda Kinneally** 13th in Masters Women. In Veteran Women – **Karen Langan** was 15th, **Linda Chan** 16th. In Super Veteran Men, **Tim Perry** was 18th and **Steve Holloway** 21st. **Graeme Hill** was 7th in Legends Men with **Ian Miller** 11th, **Steve Dunlop** 18th, Walking Women – **Emmanuelle Convert** was 3rd. **Ted Mulherin** 1st and **Barry Hanlon** 4th in Immortals men and **Janet Morris** 3rd in Immortals Women.

Moonlight Madness #1 **Emmanuelle Convert** scored 460 points (9th overall). **Dan Smith** 420 points, **John Murray** 340 points, **Emily Farebrother** 250 points, **Zachary Farebrother** 250 points, **Justine De Remy De Courcelles** 120 points, **Karen Langan** 110 points.

SL 1 and 2 This event was run in Canberra in conjunction with the National Orienteering League (NOL) event featuring interstate competitors. It was also the ACT Sprint and Middle Distance Championships and the Australian Universities Championships.

Day 1 (SL1) featured the sprint events. The NOL and University Championships had heats at Red Hill followed by finals at Canberra Girls Grammar School. **James McQuillan** competed as a member of the NSW Stingers gaining a creditable 12th place (out of 20) in heat A in 19:37. James finished 7th in the B final in 15:47 – 1:21 behind the winner.

The other classes had a single sprint event at Canberra Girls Grammar School. The best WHO result was **Yekaterina Stukova** running W12A in 13:22 to finish 2nd. **Janet Morris** (W75A) and **Barry Hanlon** (M80A) achieved second places in their veterans classes and **Matt Hackett** finished 4th in M40A with **Dmitry Stukov** finishing 11th in M45A.

Day 1 (SL2) was the Middle Distance Championships at Isaacs Ridge. **Yekaterina Stukova** again led the WHO results coming in 1st in W12A in 33:25. **Lynn Dabbs** (W65A), **Kevin Williams** (M70A) and **Janet Morris** (W75A) were 2nd. **Barry Hanlon** finished 3rd in M80A. **Matt Hackett** was 6th in M40A and **Dmitry Stukov** 16th in M45A.
